#### THE MISSION

The Monson High School experience is one that prepares its students for living, learning and working in the global community. We challenge all community members to reach their academic, social and civic potential through an engaging curriculum that promotes critical thinking, communication and collaboration. We foster a safe and secure learning environment where diversity is appreciated to ensure that our students are prepared to be lifelong learners.

#### THE COMMUNITY

Monson is a residential community with a population of 8,792, located in the greater Springfield area. The school system is comprised of one high school (7-12), one elementary school (1-6) and one early childhood center (PreK-K).

#### THE SCHOOL

Built in 2001, MHS is a comprehensive four-year public school, with a 500 student capacity. The school is a member of the Pioneer Valley Interscholastic Athletic Conference. The school is accredited by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

#### **CORONAVIRUS IMPACT**

Monson High School ceased in-person instruction on 3/12/2020 and transitioned to distance learning on 3/16/2020. During the remainder of the 2019-20 school year, students learned asynchronously from home. The school uses a semester block schedule and all grades were pass/fail for the third quarter. Students had the choice of either numerical grades or pass/fail for the fourth quarter and final grade. For the 2020-2021 academic year, MHS plans to have in-person instruction two days a week with distance learning available for the other three days and students unable to attend in-person. In the distance learning option, students will be attending synchronously via live streaming and are expected to be active participants. Our numerical grading policy will be in place this academic year, along with our entire college preparatory curriculum.

Enrollment in Grades 7-12 totals 343 and is distributed as follows:

A minimum of 140 credits is required for graduation in addition to the successful completion of the following required subjects:
